Top 5 Tips for Wet season

- Ensure all pens and objects if mobile are secured correctly—pickets and wire will assist with this.
- 2. Ensure adequate shelter—make sure pens are facing away from prevailing winds and storms, if not add internal shelters or tarpaulin
- 3. Ensure food is stored out of rain or wet areas—food will go stale or moldy quickly this can cause chickens to become very sick quickly. Any spoiled feed in pens should be removed within a day, so best to feed little and often.
- 4. Play it safe, prepare well and never go out in storms or under trees. Just because the storm is not directly overhead doesn't mean you cant get struck by lightening.
- Storms can approach quickly and suddenly so prepare well in advance.

Amazingly Easy Chicken Burgers

Not quite the time of year for culls that are viable for whole birds, however this recipe is suitable for the smaller birds where breast and leg are taken and the rest might be waste.

1kg chicken mince

1/2 cup onion, chopped

1/2 cup celery, finely chopped

1/2 cup carrot, grated

Wholegrain rolls

Lettuce

Tomatoes, sliced

Good quality mayonnaise

Sweet chilli sauce



In a bowl, combine the chicken, onion, celery and carrot. Form into 12 patties and refrigerate for 1 hour.

Cook on the barbeque or in an oiled frying pan for 5 minutes each side.

Assemble the burgers on the buns in the following order: lettuce, mayonnaise, tomato, chicken patties and sweet chilli sauce.

These can be frozen as long as a layer of "Go Between" is used to prevent sticking.

On the 9th of August I travelled to the Brisbane Royal—EKKA with Michael Holmes. I was fortunate to be selected by the VPFA and also representing my local poultry club Camperdown Poultry Club to attend the EKKA on the Richard Porter Youth Scholarship Programme for 5 days.

Richard Porter bred Minorca birds and was a passionate breeder, steward and judge at many poultry shows throughout Queensland. He was known to help many people get involved in the poultry world and he enjoyed helping them. Sadly Richard passed away last year, so a programme was started as a memorial to his passion for breeding and showing poultry. Fundraising began, to get a group of young breeders to EKKA to experience all the life about poultry exhibition.

When I arrived in Brisbane, I was greeted by Cathy and Ben Newton, and the other two boys, Braydon and Micheal. We stayed with Cathy and Ben and were treated with great hospitality and generosity. In the evenings we would help Cathy and Ben check their own birds and collect eggs, then sit down to a lovely dinner.

Ben and Cathy took us to the EKKA everyday. On judging day I helped steward with Guy Fahey. Guy was amazing to be with. He was great to talk to, and was very helpful sharing his knowledge on the different breeds. I learnt a lot from him, and I really appreciated working alongside him. He was a great person to spend time with, and so full of knowledge.





During my time at EKKA I had the opportunity to talk to many poultry breeders and exhibitors that show a large variety of breeds.

We spent two days with Grame Hopf. He gave us talks on how to get the birds safely out of the cages without damaging feathers, bird preparation and general knowledge on poultry. Grame also discussed breed standards with us and what we need to look for when selecting birds. I had a great time with him.

Braydon, Micheal and I got along really well. We had lots of fun together. We worked together taking birds out of cages for Cathy to do the photos and we helped the other judges also at times, this included helping in the sheds too.

The day before I left the EKKA was a big day, al I had the opportunity to help Cathy and Ben take more photos of the winners. My job was to take each Champion Bird out of its cage and stand it up for Cathy. This was lot of fun, and I learnt so much with the different breeds. There were so many beautiful birds on display. I must admit I was trilled when Bird of Show was a Rhode Island Red Bantam Rooster, I had actually picked him out myself when I saw him, and thought he would be hard to beat.

During the Presentation Stewards Evening, Owen Glover presented us with a copy of the Australian Poultry Standards Book and a judging jacket. Gary Phillips also gave us a talk on judging birds, and Don Candler the RNA Councilor gave us a EKKA Cap.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the VPFA for sponsoring me to do this amazing event. Thankyou to all the organizers and supporter for the Richard Porter Youth Scholarship Programme. Thanks must ago to Michael Holmes for organizing my tickets and taking me to Brisbane, Cathy and Ben Newton for opening their home to me and being so generous, Judges, Stewards and exhibitors for the days I was there. It was also great to catch up with Alf Woods, Ian Nash and Meg Millar. Everyone treated me so well.



Darling Downs Club Show with Modern Game and Orpington Feature

The Darling Downs 55th Annual show held on Sunday June 4th 2017 has been run and won. Mother Nature turned on a beautiful day. 670 Fowls from 44 exhibitors, 6 of which were juniors. Seven first time exhibitors, with Neville Smith making the long trip over from WA with two of his birds, but they never made it as they went in to a moult. Numbers were down due to a number of shows clashing locally and no pigeons.

Thanks must go to the Modern Game Club of Qld for their support donation of a sashes & trophy. Chris Hardman had 35 large & 31 bantams Orpingtons & 55 with the remaining large soft feather, Grame Hopf had 11 large & 134 bantam Moderns and 69 large hard feather, John Kendal I 136 of the remaining soft feather bantams, Cory Nordstrom 113 of the remaining hard feather bantams and David Simons 15 pairs & 73 Waterfowl.

As Secretary my job is made easier by the support of our sponsors with donation of trophies, the executive and members who step up, and help to set up the show, running the canteen, stewarding writing cards and the taking of the photos of the champions and the printing.

This year we handed out over \$2 400 worth of sashes, photos, bags of feed, poultry equipment and cash trophies, from colour/breed champions to the majors.

Breed Feature—Cayuga Ducks

Origins of Breed: America—New York State—Specifically Lake Cayuga


Classification: Heavy

Egg Colour: Slightly Tinted

Egg Production:150-200 a year

Breed Characteristics

- Carriage—To be slightly elevated with good clearance from breast to stern.
- Body—This is to be very wide and compact, broadest point is to be shoulders with the butts being prominent, body is to taper in a traditional flat iron shape towards the tail. Back is to be flat but not flat on the sides or hollow backed
- 3. Breast—Wide and a prominent feature but must be fairly deep and well rounded.
- Wings—Short wing well rounded wings carried close and higher at the front.
- Tail—Small average sized tail with small sickles and coverts in males, must be close and hard. Carriage is to be drooping in comparison to the body in males, and in females this is slightly higher



- 7. Beak—Short and well curved with a powerful look, it is to be horn or yellow or horn stripped with yellow in colour.
- 8. Eyes—Prominent, full and bold., colours are to be pale red to pearl
- 9. Neck—Slightly curved with medium length, hackles are short with minimal coverage of the neck
- 10. Legs—Very thick and strong with round and stout thighs, shanks are short well scaled but must be long enough to give a "game appearance". Feet are to be straight, long and strong with back toe is to be almost flat on the ground, . Toes are to be 4 in number and nails are to be well shaped. Colour of legs is to orange or yellow.
- 11. Feathers-Close fitting

Breed History



Cayuga duck is traditionally an American Breed originating from Lake Cayuga, New York State, America. They became first popular in this area and domesticated in a form similar to what we see today around 1850. They are believed to be descended from American Black ducks or from a hybrid of American Black ducks and Mallards, however due to their size they are most likely a blend of all the above with some domestic bloodlines added.

First ever recorded of these birds being exhibited was back in 1853 at the Maryland State Agricultural Society Show in Balti-

more, there are records of a breed class for Black Cayuga Ducks as well as at Birmingham (USA) Poultry Show, this would lead to the assumption that they were popular within these areas to have specific classes.

Britain first became aware of this new breed around 1855, with many articles written about its origin and the beauty of the birds. They were highly prized and there are recordings in history of notable people receiving these ducks as gifts or sales. Over time their popularity grew.





Breed Character

The Cayuga is classified as a heavy breed by the Australian Poultry Standards with an weight range of 2.7-3.6 kg for males, and females being slightly lower at 2.25 to 3.2 kg.

The most notable character for this bird is their beautiful black plumage with a dark green sheen and black bill, this gives them an almost iridescent look when in natural light. They have a graceful appearance with a slight upright stance.

Cayuga's generally make great pets as they are friendly and less flighty than other breeds, they make a nice alternative to Pekin Ducks which can be noisy as these tend to be less vocal.

They also breed easy with ducks going broody as required and incubation is 28 days, ducklings hatch with a beautiful black fluff.

These are an amazing breed and well worth the struggle to find good stock.

There are a few breeders out there so it is worth contacting your local club for more information.
